The SCQF has been at the centre of Scottish education since its inception in 2001. It has evolved over the years and now contains over 11,800 qualifications owned by around 300 different organisations.

However, its uses go far beyond just helping individuals understand qualifications. It can support development and understanding of learning and career pathways, it can support employers in effective recruitment and workforce development and also provides a means of identifying and recognising an individual's level of experiential and non-formal learning. The SCQF represents quality in the Scottish education system and clearly underpins key government strategies focused on developing an education and skills system that is fit for Scotland in the 21st Century. It supports the National Performance Framework ensuring that outcomes on educational attainment, skills profiling and participation can be measured and improved. This supports the NPF mission that, "We are well educated, skilled and able to contribute to society".



About The Scottish Credit and Qualifications Framework (SCQF)

The Scottish Credit and Qualifications Framework (SCQF) is Scotland's lifelong learning framework.

THE FRAMEWORK IS DESIGNED TO:

- help people plan their learning journeys, so as to fulfil their personal, social and economic potential;
- enable all individuals, employers and organisations in Scotland to:
 - understand and compare the full range and parity of Scottish qualifications;
 - develop and understand learning and career pathways;
 - understand how different qualifications and learning can help improve workforce development and skills utilisation;
 - relate Scottish qualifications to qualifications in other countries;
 - use the SCQF Level Descriptors to assist with qualifications development and benchmarking skills and experience.
- support the Scottish Government aims of fair work and social justice by providing tools and resources which can recognise prior learning, support progression and improve social inclusion.



Our Stakeholders

In developing this plan we have continued to take full account of the views of our partners and stakeholders to ensure that we, along with others, are playing as full a part as possible in supporting Government agendas around education and the economy.



Our partners are our key to success and we are mindful of this when developing both our strategic and operational priorities.

Key Drivers of Future Activity

Maintaining quality and integrity is key to preserving confidence in Scottish qualifications and we will continue to work with Credit Rating Bodies to ensure that the SCQF is seen as a mark of quality.

2022-25 will be a period of significant change in the sector. The recommendations from the Education Reform Review led by Professor Ken Muir will require careful implementation and it was clear during the Education Reform review that those consulted identified the SCQF as one of the key advantages within the Scottish education system and something which should be built on. Discussions will need to take place with Scottish Government on how best to increase the visibility and reach of the Framework.

Linked to that is the work being led by Professor Louise Hayward on qualification reform where we wish to see the SCQF being utilised as fully as possible including further thought on learning pathways and progression routes.

The replacement of SQA will be important for us as it currently acts as three Credit Rating Bodies accounting for around 25% of the qualifications on the SCQF. We will need to work with SQA and its successor(s) to ensure continuity of quality assurance.

The recommendations from the SFC review of tertiary education accepted by Scottish Government will also provide drivers not just for us but for many of our partners and stakeholders. We have already identified a number of areas where we see the SCQF providing a solid basis for joint development including our work to support Recognition of Prior Learning, work based learning, and microcredentials. In addition, use of the SCQF is key to the development of pathways, progression routes and credit transfer.

In the work-based area of delivery we will want to ensure that we can support the National strategy for Economic Transformation and the commitment to a National digital Academy.



We will be dealing with the fallout from the pandemic and the changes that it has brought about in the sector. This means that we will need to ensure that we are responsive, flexible, digitally aware and creative in our work to support the Scottish economy in its recovery from the pandemic.



Our Strategic Priorities

THE SCQF PARTNERSHIP HAS SIX STRATEGIC PRIORITIES FOR THE PERIOD 2022-25:

- Maintaining quality and integrity
- Supporting key Government priorities around education, training and skills including education reform, tertiary and work-based learning delivery
- Supporting SCQF Credit Rating Bodies
- Promoting Recognition of Prior Learning
- Engaging with employers
- Driving wider implementation of the SCQF as a lifelong learning tool

The SCQF Operational Plan for each year sets out the annual objectives which help deliver these priorities.
