Staff leading the SA programme should ensure all school staff are aware of the aims & benefits via an SCQF presentation & are involved in forward planning & implementation of the SA programme *

Within 3 months of reaching Silver, schools are expected to produce a short blog on their SCQF journey *

School Ambassador programme embedded into the culture of the school. SCQF clearly mentioned in development/school improvement plans & system in place to review progress every year

Criteria: Recognition Programme for SCQF School Ambassadors



Pupils are made aware of the SCQF by school staff who should identify & train pupils to take part in the School Ambassador programme

With support from school staff mentors, pupil Ambassadors deliver annual sessions on the SCQF to senior phase & BGE pupils *

Pupils are leading SCQF promotion & receiving recognition for their work through leadership awards or other programmes e.g. SQA leadership awards, volunteering award

New pupil ambassadors are appointed each year & are involved in supporting pupil Ambassadors in neighbouring schools new to the programme Parental Engagement & Understanding

Pupil Ambassadors are delivering awarenessraising sessions at parents' evenings of both BGE & senior phase year groups *
